Description of Services:

Cannabis Group at Clyde Children's Centre

This is a cannabis support group for parents and parents expecting a child that use cannabis and would like support to stop, if parents have pre-school age children it has the ability to provide a crèche. CRI/Lifeline will make contact to introduce you to this service.

Women's Group (Women who use substances and/or alcohol)

This is a woman only group who have children and want support with their drug or alcohol use. If women have pre-school age children it has the ability to provide a crèche. CRI will make contact to introduce the service.

Befriending / Peer Support from Service Users

This is a befriending service to support woman who are scared or fearful of entering substance misuse service, it is a service provided by woman volunteers who have completed their own treatment for addiction. It is supported by CRI New directions. CRI will make contact in the first instance and refer you for peer support.

Family and Carers Support

This is a service for family members and carers (over the age of 18) of people who use drugs or alcohol (Their family member does not need to be accessing treatment). Family members and carers can access 1:1 support, Counselling, Complimentary Therapy, Carers Support Group, SMART Family and Friends Group, IAPT Referrals, training and onward referral to other services.

Overdose Training

Training for adult family members and carers of what to do in case of suspected drug overdose along with access to prenoxad emergency Opiate blocker.

Young People at risk of/or using drugs/alcohol:

Lifeline supports young people (11-25) who are using or at risk of using drugs and alcohol, young people can be seen in a variety of community settings. If you tick this box someone from Lifeline will contact you to introduce their services.

Young person affected by a parents/carers substance misuse:

Lifeline supports young people (11-18) who are affected by an adult's substance misuse to help them build resilience and access support. If you tick this box someone from Lifeline will contact you to explain what support they can offer.

Parents who want support with their alcohol or substance use:

Support service for parents who would like more control around their alcohol and drug use. Treatment options range from brief intervention and harm minimisation, community detox and psychosocial interventions in community settings like GP surgeries. If you tick this box someone from the primary care service will contact you to explain what support they can offer.

Support for parents whose children under 18 use drugs and alcohol:

Support service for parents whose children under 18 are using drugs or alcohol and would like to access peer support and information and advice.

Relapse prevention, aftercare and re-integration for parents who have recovered from addiction within the last two years:

Support for parents who have given up drugs and alcohol within the last two years, who want support to remain drug and alcohol free and reintegrate back into the community and access education and employment.
